## NEW YORK STATE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT (NYSED) K-3 LITERACY CURRICULUM REVIEW GUIDE

On June 5, 2024, NYSED hosted a webinar on releasing the new K-3 Literacy Curriculum Review Guide. The guide is designed for optional use by districts and schools in selecting high-quality K-3 literacy curricula and curricular materials designed to meet the needs of all students, including English language learners and students with disabilities. The guide may be useful in connecting pedagogy to practice in programs leading to initial certification in Early Childhood Education (Birth to Grade 2), Childhood Education (Grades 1 - 6), Students with Disabilities (All Grades), and Literacy (All Grades). #### DO YOU KNOW?

Composition is one of the critical elements of creating a portrait. When creating a portrait of a certified teacher in New York State, initial teacher knowledge, skills, and dispositions are the foundational compositional elements of that first likeness. The Commissioner's Regulations and well-researched policy endorsed by the Board of Regents are the raw materials the Department relies on to create the critical first sketch of every newly certified teacher in New York State.

Using the <u>Teacher Performance Assessment (TPA)</u> as the initial portrait canvas, newly certified teachers will have demonstrated pedagogical core knowledge codified <u>in Section 52.21 of the Commissioner's Regulations</u>, content knowledge in the subject area of the certificate sought as outlined in <u>New York State Learning Standards</u>, and teaching skills grounded in <u>The New York State Teaching Standards</u> and the <u>Culturally Responsive-Sustaining Education Framework</u>. Including the competencies for <u>Social Emotional Learning and Adult Practice</u> adds dimension to the dispositions important to effective teaching.

The picture of the teacher that emerges when the candidate completes the TPA is different from the finished gallery-worthy portrait. It is the first iteration in an ongoing study of a teaching professional, and the TPA is the beginning of a continuum of professional practice.

The experiences a teacher has in their first years of teaching, following the completion of the TPA, can help to add depth, shape, and vibrant color to the portrait. A planned and well-executed induction and mentoring program during that time, followed by regular professional learning, is critical to the evolving composition of a teacher's professional journey, always refining and enhancing the portrait.

#### FOSTERING POSITIVE BEHAVIOR IN PREKINDERGARTEN CLASSROOMS

The Office of Early Learning has developed a dedicated webpage entitled <u>Positive Behavior Guidance</u> that includes a series of resources for educators and families to help foster positive interactions in the prekindergarten environment. Resources include information, guidance, strategies, and frequently asked questions to build systems and practices that promote positive behavior and social-emotional learning within the prekindergarten classroom.
