

Audiologist


Audiologists have training in anatomy and physiology, hearing aids, cochlear implants, electrophysiology, acoustics, neurology, and counseling. They are the primary healthcare provider who evaluate, diagnose, treat and manage hearing loss and balance disorders in patients of all ages.

Education: Audiologists must hold a doctoral degree.

Audiologists are required to hold and maintain a NYS license. To maintain the licensing, Continuing Education Units need to be maintained by completing educational trainings related to the field of Audiology. Many Audiologists in NYS also hold a license to dispense hearing aids.

Services at NYSSD

- Provide audiological testing to current students and students wishing to apply.
- Troubleshoot hearing aids and cochlear implants
- Provide ear molds and swim molds as needed
- Provide and maintain assistive technology to hearing loss.
- Provide reports when testing is completed
- Maintain contact with students home Audiologist
- Provide in-service training to staff and professionals as needed
- Repairs and programming of hearing aids.
- Provide aural habilitation/ rehabilitation to students as needed.



- Assist in student intakes and Multidisciplinary Team meetings
- Stay up to date on new technology
- Work closely with the Deaf Infant
 Coordinator and provide home visits
- Meet with teachers and speech therapists regarding student's technology monthly
- Consult with off campus placements for our students regarding hearing loss and associated needs
