

The NYS Seal of Biliteracy (NYSSB) 2023-2024



The NYSSB is an award given to a student who has demonstrated a high level of proficiency in English and one or more world languages.



499 schools offered the NYSSB.



10,591 students earned the NYSSB.



2,874 Current and Former English Language Learners (ELLs) earned the NYSSB. (27%)

5,798 Never ELLs whose home language is English earned the NYSSB. (55%)

1,919 Never ELLs whose home language is not English earned the NYSSB. (18%)

Current ELLs are students who, by birth or ancestry, speak or understand a language other than English and who scored below a NYS designated level of proficiency on the NYSITELL or the NYSESLAT. Ever ELLs are students who were once ELLs, but who have since demonstrated the NYS designated level of proficiency necessary to exit ELL status. Never ELLs are students who have never been identified as ELLs.



6,998 female students earned the NYSSB. (66%)



3,575 male students earned the NYSSB. (33.8%)



18 non-binary students earned the NYSSB. (0.2%)



328 students earned the NYSSB in TWO world languages in addition to English.

17 students earned the NYSSB in THREE world languages in addition to English.

3 students earned the NYSSB in FOUR world languages in addition to English. **1** student earned the NYSSB in FIVE world languages in addition to English.
