The Office of Bilingual Education and World Languages (OBEWL) of the New York State Education Department (NYSED) presents this next webinar in its 2024 Professional Learning Series: Enhancing Instructional Design: Aligning Your Daily Practice with the Revised Standards. This webinar is offered free of charge for world language educators and administrators working or studying in New York State educational institutions.



Webinar description: This webinar will provide examples of how two middle school teachers have designed practical, everyday lessons that meaningfully enact the revised NYS Learning Standards for World Languages at Checkpoint A. The presenters will demonstrate proven strategies that you can use to develop standards-based lessons for novice learners. They will share examples of sequenced learning tasks that boost learner confidence and performance in the various communication modes. They will also discuss how these approaches scaffold learner readiness for the Checkpoint A Benchmark Proficiency Assessment.
