
Checkpoint A Benchmark Proficiency Assessment Item Writing Workshop for Modern Languages

The Office of Bilingual Education and World Languages (OBEWL) of the New York State Education Department (NYSED) presents this next webinar in its 2024 Professional Learning Series: **Checkpoint A Benchmark Proficiency Assessment Item Writing Workshop for Modern Languages.** This webinar is offered free of charge for world language educators and administrators working or



studying in New York State educational institutions. Participants must commit to attending the full webinar from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. (with a one-hour break, the time for which will be designated by the presenter) in order to receive a certificate.

Webinar description: This 6-hour live virtual workshop will engage NYS world language educators in understanding and applying the <u>Principles and Guidelines for Adopting or Creating Locally Developed</u> <u>Benchmark Assessments for Checkpoint A for Modern Languages</u>.* The presenters will explain and model assessment items for each Communication Standard aligned to the aforementioned guidance. Participants will have the opportunity to construct assessment items for Interpretive, Interpresonal, and Presentational Communication at Checkpoint A that adhere to these guidelines. The workshop will run from 8:30 am to 2:30 pm with a one-hour lunch on your own at a time designated by the presenters.

In preparation for this online workshop, participants are asked to:

- download and read the document <u>Principles and Guidelines for Adopting or Creating Locally Developed</u> <u>Benchmark Assessments for Checkpoint A for Modern Languages</u>
- view the <u>webinar</u> by the same name and test their knowledge of the guidance following the viewing of the webinar by taking the <u>online post assessment</u> (Additional versions of the post assessment can be found on the <u>webinar's page</u>, if needed.)

In addition, participants should bring their laptop or other device to use during the workshop.

*Principles and Guidelines for Adopting or Creating Locally Developed Benchmark Assessments for Checkpoint

<u>A for Modern Languages</u> is a document that provides guidance for the creation of Checkpoint A Benchmark Assessments aligned to the revised NYS Learning Standards for World Languages. Benchmark assessments are those assessments used to award one high school credit for middle school students prior to entering Grade 9 and to meet the one-credit graduation requirement. Checkpoint A Benchmark Assessments must be aligned to the revised standards for the June 2025 administration.

Registration process: All participants must pre-register for this event. Pre-registration will close on Friday, November 1st, 2024; there will be no same-day registrations. Once the registrant's email address has been verified as being from a New York State school, college, or university, an email confirming their registration will be sent. Twenty-four hours prior to the event, all registered individuals will receive login instructions with the link to join the webinar. **Only pre-registered attendees will be eligible for a certificate documenting attendance and/or CTLE hours.**
