Currently, over 500 schools offer this crucial program, and more than 48,000 students have engaged in meaningful civic learning experiences that empower them to contribute positively to their communities. Through hands-on projects, community involvement, and classroom learning, these students are developing the skills and knowledge necessary for active citizenship.
